Basic How-To

(1) Go to: http://www.hdnfmc.com/community.php and click on Humboldt and Del Norte Counties Community Resource Website

(2) Find relevant topic(s) related to information needed and click on topic bubble.

(3) Find relevant sub-topic or program needed and click to expand.

Note: an icon to the right of items means there is a webpage link to more information – click on the icon **at the bottom of the screen** to open.

(4) If specific programs are listed, click to expand. Important information may be provided in the white space below the resource map such as website links (click to open), contact information, or additional service information.

(5) Click on additional levels as needed, some sub-topics have many programs within them.

Terms Commonly Used

Path – Shows the trail of clicks to get to current item.

Pin – Will always remain onscreen. Used for frequently accessed items. The homepage, Humboldt Department of Health & Human Services and contact us are pins.

Sub-topic or child thought – specific issues within each topic. Narrower concept.

Sibling thoughts – related topics or thoughts to currently selected item.

Search Bar – can be used to quickly pull up any specific topic or thought. Only searches titles of thoughts.

Topic or parent thought - Grouped by need or subject matter. Broad concept.

Topic Areas

<u>Child & Youth</u> – Includes resources for child care & development, child welfare, recreation, various support services for parents, and youth development and mentorship.

<u>Education</u> – Information from school readiness, primary and secondary schools, and adult educational resources.

<u>Employment Development</u> – Includes youth specific sources, workforce support, job readiness, and job seeker resources.

Financial Assistance – Financial assistance for businesses and for individuals seeking resources.

<u>Food Security</u> – A family is "food secure" when they are able to afford enough to eat. This resource links to food assistance: food pantries, food stamps, WIC, and school food programs.

<u>Health</u> – Describes the health network in Humboldt County. Includes hospitals, clinics, tribal services, mental health, womens health, and more.

<u>Housing</u> – Various types of housing assistance resources: rental assistance, shelters, transitional housing, permanent supportive housing, energy assistance, outreach, and clean and sober housing.

Human Rights - Includes advocacy resources for Latinos, Tribes, the disabled, and LGBT.

<u>Legal</u> – Low cost attorney services and alternatives can be found here.

<u>Recreation</u> – Community Activities, calendars, and government parks & recs departments.

<u>Seniors</u> – A variety of senior services: housing, medical, food access, adult day health center, adult education, advocacy, and elder abuse.

<u>Tobacco & Substance Abuse Treatment</u> – Resources to address tobacco and other drug abuse and treatment options - including residential, outpatient, and 12 step programs.

<u>Transportation</u> – Transportation resources for planning, paratransit, alternative transportation, non-emergency medical transport and advocacy.


<u>Violence Prevention & Support</u> – Includes resources for all age groups: children and elder. Also includes domestic violence resources, rape crisis and legal resources.




